Mid-South Synergy Begins Construction on New Water Tower in Woodforest

Residents in Woodforest recently might have noticed a new water tower being constructed towards the back of the development. This will be a brand new 1,000,000-gallon elevated storage tank that is being constructed by Mid-South Synergy Water Resources to serve members in the Woodforest development and surrounding areas. Due to recent growth in the area, we felt it was time to improve our water system by adding an additional water storage facility to better serve our members and improve system reliability.

“We want to be able to provide the residents on our Montgomery Trace Water System continued reliable service,” said Jon Blakley, MSEC Operations Manager. “Currently, we have approximately 2,400 connections in Woodforest alone that pull water from this system.”

Mid-South Synergy worked with the Woodforest development team to find a perfect location for the new water tower, which began construction in September of 2016. This location is at a higher elevation within the development, which allows the storage tank to operate more efficiently.

“The overall water system will be more reliable from this new elevated storage tank, since all of the water is actually up in the air,” said Blakley. “The tank uses gravity to provide pressure, as opposed to an underground system, which relies on electricity. If we have a power outage, we’re still able to provide service to our members.”

Phase I of the tower is projected to be completed by the beginning of April.
